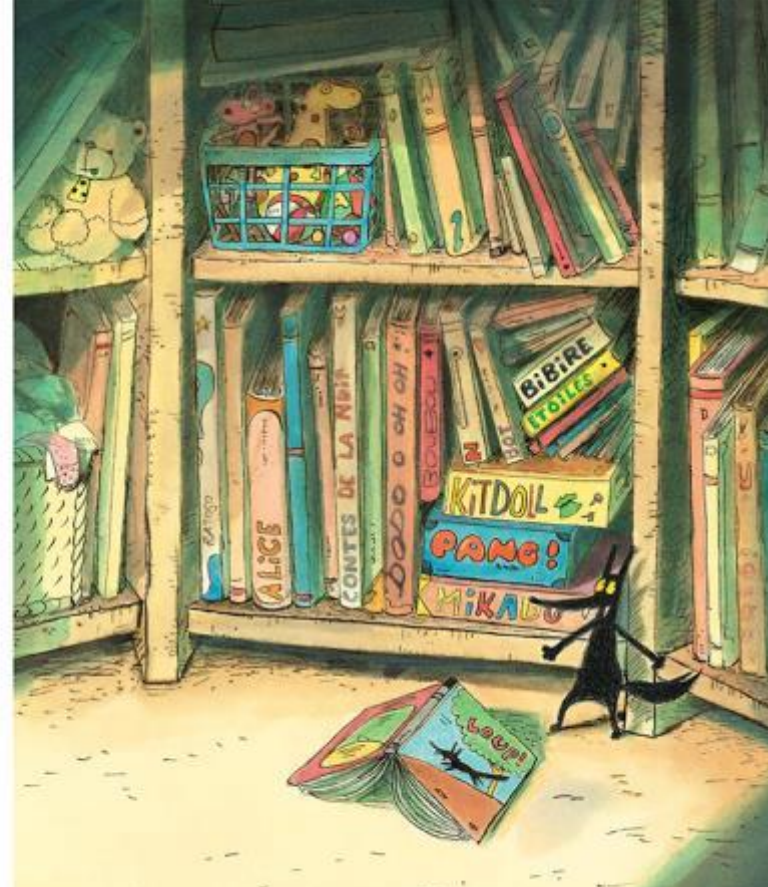
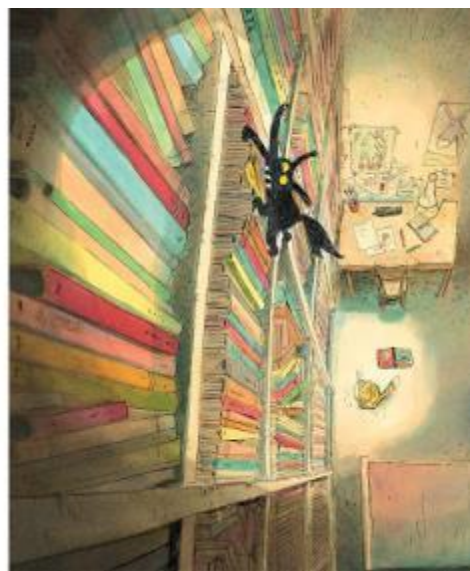
Le loup tombé du livre

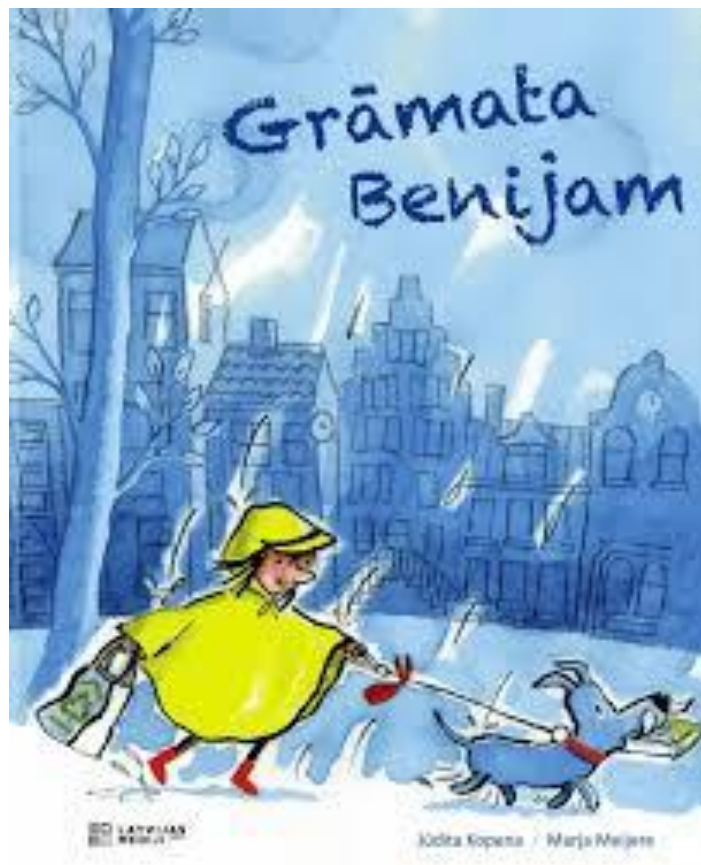

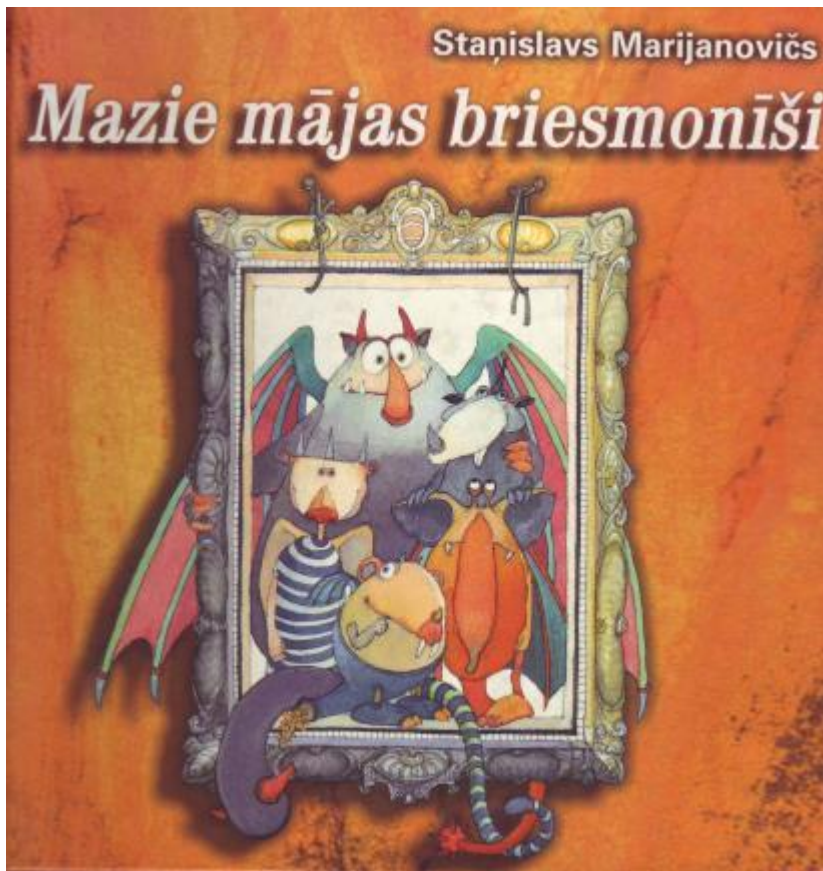

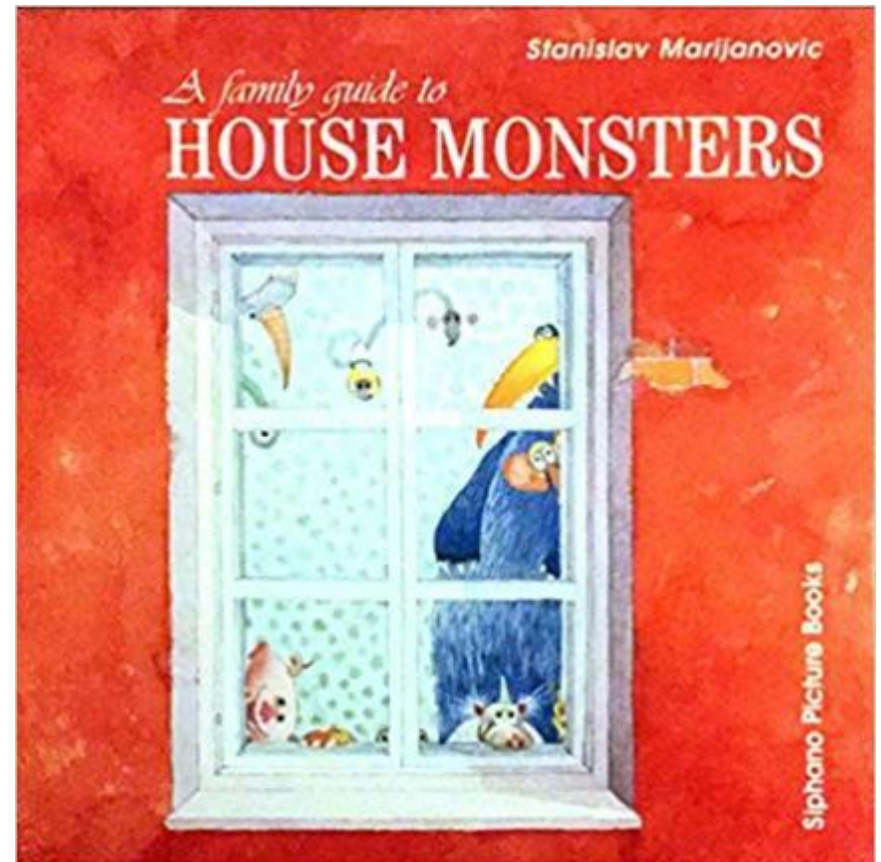
